


Overview provides access to information about the curriculum, including design and structure, cross-curriculum priorities, diversity of learners and navigation and terminology

Welcome

The Victorian Curriculum Foundation-10 (F-10) sets out what every student should learn during their first eleven years of schooling. The curriculum is the common set of knowledge and skills that are required by students for life-long learning, social development and active and informed citizenship.

The curriculum defines what students should learn. It includes both knowledge and skills and describes a progression of learning. Schools use the curriculum to plan how students will be taught and supported to learn in ways that best utilise local resources, expertise and contexts.
